FOCUS ON EDUCATION

V firginia is fortunate to have such an array of choices for higher education -60 four-year colleges and 47 two-year colleges are accredited in the state.

The following information is compiled from the College Board 2008 College Handbook. Where data is available, the scholasticaptitude test (SAT) scores listed represent the mid-50 percentile of the freshman class.

Visit the colleges' individual Web sites for specific information on each one's basis for selection as well as expectations for gradepoint average (GPA), class rank, and high school preparation. Determine which schools encourage interviews and/or which ones put emphasis on recommendations or essays. Certain schools for the arts require portfolios and/or auditions. Seniors from homeschooled backgrounds usually have specific transcript requirements. Important information is easily accessible on annual costs, financial aid, faculty, majors, special facilities, special study options, credit/ placement exams, and internship possibilities.

The second compilation is a list of the two-year colleges in Virginia. The Virginia Community College System serves more than 240,000 credit students per year. It oversees a network of 23 community colleges that serves residents of the state, providing twoyear degree programs, specialty training, and certifications. When a student does not have a solid GPA, a junior college or community college offers a way to take college-level classes in a small setting, often providing a greater chance of building a strong GPA with the goal of transferring credits to a four-year college or university. Certain junior colleges have feeder programs into highly competitive colleges such as Richard Bland's program that is affiliated with the College of William & Mary. There are many possible paths toward a final goal. You may be surprised to discover all the excellent possible options in our Commonwealth, so start exploring them.
